## Women Psychoanalysts: Stories and Theories

The women included in this course were practitioners of psychoanalysis and wrote extensively about their work. These women have been selected because of the significance of their thought for psychoanalytic practice. Some of them were ostracized by other psychoanalysts and the importance of their thought may have been neglected, ignored, or forgotten, and their work may have been derogated. The goal of this series is to bring out the indisputable contributions of these four women to psychoanalysis and the practice of psychotherapy.

**Oliva M. Espín** is Professor Emerita in the Department of Women's Studies at San Diego State University and the California School of Professional Psychology of Alliant International University. A native of Cuba, she specialized in counseling and therapy with women from different cultures and in Latin American Studies.

This course will make relevant the impact of the automobile on our everyday lives so even those who do not tout the title of "gearhead" may enjoy the experience and walk away with more knowledge and insight into our world than they had before.

Pandora Paúl is the Curator at America's Automotive Trust and LeMay America's Car Museum in Tacoma, Washington. She grew up in Southern California enjoying drives in her father's red '59 Convertible Corvette, her mom's '70 Opel GT, and cruising while in high school in her '77 Malibu Classic station wagon. Her career has included both work and play in museum education, training, and curation. Pandora was part of the team at the San Diego Automotive Museum, creating award-winning exhibits. She has served on the Board of Directors of the National Association of Automobile Museums. She loves to showcase vehicles that have not seen before, as well as interpreting cars in unique ways that inspire conversation and create wonder and awe. She believes that automobiles are snapshots of our culture.

## **Spring Classes (completed)**

#### The Roaring Twenties

Stacy Wallach will begin his twelve-week history of the 1920s. The second six weeks will be in the summer semester. Tom Gerety will join Stacy with a guest lecture on the Supreme Court and free speech in the 1920s.

#### **Inventing Modernism**

David Langston, a favorite OLLI instructor and emeritus MCLA professor, will introduce "Modernism" a ubiquitous, reviled and revered, movement that shaped all the arts as it came to full flower in the 1920s.

### **Summer Classes**

#### The Roaring Twenties

Stacy Wallach's history of the 1920s will continue for six-weeks in late June and July. Peter Levine will join Stacy for a special class on music of the 1920s.

#### The Harlem Renaissance

This nine-week overview of the Harlem Renaissance will be taught by a team of experienced OLLI instructors and guests including: Frances Jones-Sneed, PhD emeritus professor of history from MCLA; David Mickenberg, PhD, art historian and museum director; and David Langston, PhD, MCLA emeritus professor of literature.

#### Science and Medicine in the 1920s

This eleven-week class will introduce key innovations in medicine and many of the puzzles of astronomy and quantum physics that scientists are still exploring today.
